




Partnerships & Collaborations

With the recent addition of the Cape2Clarens Wine Festival, Clarens now hosts three annual "By Clarens for Clarens" events, each contributing to the village's reputation as a vibrant and collaborative community. These events— the Clarens Arts Festival, the Titanic Challenge Trail Run, and the Cape2Clarens Wine Festival—collectively enhance the local calendar, attracting discerning visitors and further establishing Clarens as a premier destination for festivals of this nature. While not all these events are culturally focused, each one plays a pivotal role in elevating the profile of Clarens and its collaborative spirit.





Giving Back

The Clarens Arts Festival remains committed to making a positive impact on the local community through a variety of giving-back initiatives. During the 2025 festival, a total of 100 blankets, which were used at the opening Long Table event and various other outdoor events, were donated to local creches as part of the national Project Winterhope, demonstrating the festival's dedication to supporting vulnerable members of the community.

Looking ahead, the ArtStart Clarens programme is set to launch in 2026 with the support of ATKV, Tshwane University of Technology and other key partners and local schools. This initiative will focus on year-round engagement through a series of free/low-cost workshops/masterclasses designed to nurture creativity and provide valuable learning opportunities for young people in the Greater Clarens area. The programme will provide exposure to professional artists across multiple disciplines and create mentorship opportunities between professionals and aspiring artists.

In addition to these educational efforts, the Clarens Arts
Festival will be supporting the Tshepong Christmas Party by
sponsoring a performance artist to entertain the 180
children, ensuring an enjoyable and memorable experience
for the youth.

The Clarens Arts Festival also proudly endorses and supports the annual Festival of Flavours, an event that celebrates the diverse heritage of Clarens and brings together residents in a shared appreciation of local talent.

Furthermore, the Festival extends its support to educational and youth-focused activities, such as the Spelling Bee competition organised by the Tshireletsa Bana Foundation earlier this year in which 60 children participated.



To further invest in the future of local talent, the Clarens Arts Festival aims to establish a Bursary Fund to support identified individuals with exceptional artistic promise. This fund aims to provide financial assistance and encourage continued growth and development within the arts.
